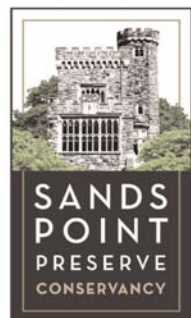

Very few people are aware of the fact that this astonishingly large and eco-rich natural habitat exists on the Port Washington Peninsula. In fact, at 240 acres, this area is the largest natural habitat on the Peninsula. Formerly known as the "Hempstead Harbor Sand Pits" and henceforth referred to as the Hempstead Harbor Nature Sanctuary (HHNS), the area supports the greatest diversity of flora, fauna, and biological communities on the peninsula. The HHNS also contains Port Washington's largest freshwater wetland and is an important part of Port Washington's groundwater system. The Town of North Hempstead will soon be holding visioning sessions to determine the future of this area. Attend the meeting or email the Committee to Protect and Preserve a HHNS at HHNatureSanctuary@gmail.com to find out what you can do to protect this amazing natural area so crucial to our region's wetlands, waters, and biodiversity.

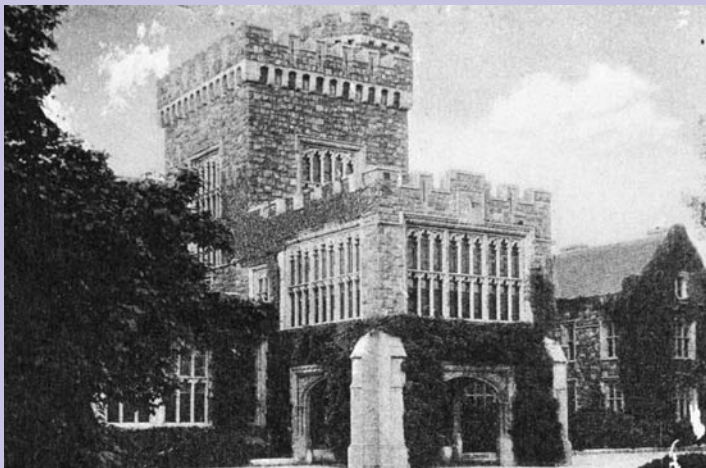
