Every Saturday through October, the Port Washington Organic Farmers' Market is held at the Town Dock from 8 am - noon

The market, now in its fourteenth year, is managed by Grassroots Environmental Education and is the place to go for fresh, locally-grown, organic produce and specialty items. It is the only 100% organic farmers' market in New York. East End farmers bring truckloads of fresh vegetables, local bakers offer fantastic breads, cakes and organic coffee, and organic blueberry muffins, eggs, goat cheese and honey are popular with market regulars.

PUBLISHER'S COLUMN

The other day, some friends were lamenting the shrinking, and sometimes the disappearance, of many service organizations. Lions, Kiwanis,

Rotary, and others had a common thought that life

was good and it was only right to spend some time and resources towards those who had not fared as well. Many members were shopkeepers who took an hour or so for lunch once a week, or commuters who hurried home to make a dinner meeting.

The fact is, those options may not be so easy any more... many shops have just one person 'on the floor' during the day prohibiting closing to attend 'some meeting'. Getting out of the city early is just as problematic.

The result is the shrinking of many of these organizations and the changing demographics of those that seem to have survived. Basically most of these organizations are dominated by what we euphemistically call 'seniors'. The organizations are having a difficult time attracting younger folks.

You may not view this is earthshaking, but the primary reason I could give for the demise is simple...'Time'. Everyone seems to be so busy it is difficult to enjoy whatever it is they want. There just isn't 'Time'.

So, we now see many of the same (older) faces participating in whatever the event or organization. Maybe if the work load was spread out a little more we could all have time... and feel good about helping.

The bottom line is ... do not wait for a formal invitation from your favorite social or civic organization. Introduce yourself and ask how you can help them meet their goals. Maybe HarborFest is a good place to start. There will be many worthwhile organizations describing their intentions and efforts... so, how about simply walking up to one or two of them and asking "How can I help?"

I'll bet you will feel better immediately.
