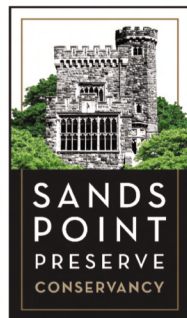

Music Director Steven Lutvak brings an exceptionally talented band to accompany Tony winner Chuck Cooper, a veteran of 14 Broadway shows, and Marva Hicks, who starred on Broadway in *The Lion King*, *Motown the Musical*, and *Lena Horne: The Lady and Her Music*. Hicks also performed with Stevie Wonder, Michael Jackson, and Whitney Houston.

Lutvak, who is currently writing a new musical commissioned by Disney, said, "I love performing here, and I especially love these jazz nights. These musicians are young and terrific, and the singers have had tremendous careers. Chuck will perform his gorgeous rendition of Billy Strayhorn's *Lush Life*. It promises to be a great night, worthy of the best NYC jazz clubs."

A culinary feast will be prepared by Philip Stone Caterers, and guests will be seated at private tables located throughout the stately, mahogany-paneled Billiards Room, Library, Summer Living Room and Palm Court. The performance takes

place in the Winter Living Room beside a massive stone hearth.
